

Ealing Broadway Cycle Hub

As we reported briefly in the last issue, the council has secured £286,500 from TfL to create a cycle hub at Ealing Broadway station. The money is being allocated over three years, with the bulk of the funding, £215,000, coming this year for the construction of three cycle parking shelters and installation of new stands on the corner of Haven Green. The development, which is due to go out for consultation soon, will see the number of

cycle parking spaces rise from 74 to 112, all but 6 of them under cover. The shelters will each be fitted with CCTV to improve security.

To make way for the extra spaces, the plan is to remove one of the two lanes in the taxi slip road next to the present stands. In return, the old wooden taxi drivers' rest facility will be replaced by a new building which will include cooking facilities and a toilet.

Cycle on motor-free streets

After leading a feeder ride to the Hillingdon SkyRide on 31st July we will lead feeder rides to the Central London SkyRide on 4th September. The feeder rides will be in traffic, but the SkyRides are traffic-free. See our website for details.

New Hanger Lane Cycle Crossing

Acycle bypass for Hanger Lane Gyratory has been created with the opening of a new cycle crossing over Hanger Lane North. This was a vital missing link on the London Cycle Network (LCN) route which runs from Kew Bridge to Neasden via central Ealing. It is the last major scheme in Ealing to be funded by the London Cycle Network plus project, which has funded numerous cycle improvements throughout the borough.

The crossing was first suggested in the 2005 study which identified the work needed to create Ealing's section of this LCN route.

The previous route through the subways at the Gyratory was narrow and indirect, and shared with pedestrians. Cyclists will still need to use the subways for some journeys, but not as many as before.

The crossing is for cycles only. Pedestrians are not catered for because the time to cross is too short. Increasing the crossing time could increase congestion on the gyratory.

Ealing Station Lift

ur long-running campaign for better access to Ealing Broadway station received a boost in July with news that the council are hoping to bring forward the installation of a lift. Lifts were already planned as part of the Crossrail reconstruction which was scheduled for completion in 2017, but work on this is now unlikely to begin before 2018. Rather than wait another seven years, Bassam Mahfouz, the councilor in charge of transport, is negotiating with Network Rail and Crossrail to install one of the lifts early with the help of council funding.

Ealing Cycle Campaign is working to make sure the lift will be large enough to do the job. The present proposal is for a lift 1.6 metres square which is the EU minimum for disabled access. We would prefer a lift 1.6 x 2.4 metres long to allow room for bicycles, which are typically up to two metres long, and other large luggage.

Bus Lanes

Ealing's Bus lanes are safer to cycle Ein. In July Ealing Council ended its trial scheme of allowing motorbikes in bus lanes. Unfortunately we will have to wait another 6 months for the end of TfL's trial on other routes. We await the safety report on that with interest.

Explorer Rides

In July, we launched the first of the Ealing Explorer rides - a departure from our usual rides, with the idea of a team getting a list of targets to reach within an allotted time, gaining points as they go. This is part of our "Month of Sundays" project; a collection of small sub-projects surrounding cycling: from bike polo try outs, art projects, food inspired rides and a lot more.
